The issue we as an international community would like to raise today is the Execution of Assisted Euthanasia in Cases of Mental Health. This subject matter raises significant debate concerning the negative and positive impacts of Euthanasia.

Assisted Euthanasia is a subject shrouded in ethical, medical, and legal complexities and remains one of the most polarizing topics in contemporary health care. This practice involves a patient voluntarily ending their life with the assistance of a healthcare provider, typically in the context of terminal illness or unbearable suffering. The idea is that instead of condemning someone to a slow, painful, or undignified death, euthanasia would allow the patient to experience a relatively “good death.”. Across the globe, it is legality and moral standing vary, reflecting deep cultural, religious, and philosophical divide.

In Honduras, euthanasia is illegal, since there are a series of factors that prevent its implementation. Politics, economics, among other reasons, are the cause that in this country the legality of this process is not possible. However, this delegation considers that this could be a great way to end the suffering of people whose lives are tormented and dominated by physical and psychological pain.
